CYFIP2 EIEE/DEE REFERRAL CHECKLIST

This is a list of commonly required medical services. Not all children will need each service listed.

_	Pediatric Neurologist : Essential for managing epilepsy and developmental concerns.
_	Epileptologist : A Neurologist specializing in complex epilepsy and refractory seizures.
_	Geneticist/Genetics Counselor: Helps families understand the genetic basis of CYFIP2 EIEE, offers guidance on inheritance patterns, prognosis and testing for family members,
_	Developmental Pediatrician: Monitors and manages developmental delays and disabilities coordinates therapies and educational interventions.
	Nutritional/Feeding Specialist : Evaluates for potential dietary therapies such as the Keto diet for seizure control, manages feeding issues such as oral motor delays, evaluates need for G-Tube placement.
	Pediatric Hematologist: Some children with CYFIP2 EIEE/DEE experience severe neutropenia (low neutrophil count) requiring routine monitoring and/or additional medications.
	Occupational Therapist: Focuses on fine motor skills, daily living activities and may address sensory integration issues.
-	Physical Therapist : Focuses on gross motor development, muscle tone and mobility, can provide adaptive equipment if needed.
	Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) : Addresses communication challenges, including speech delays and feeding difficulties, implements communication strategies if necessary.
_	Neuro-ophthalmologist: Diagnoses and manages visual issues related to the nervous system, some children with CYFIP2 EIEE/DEE experience visual impairments such as CVL

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Vision Therapist: Provides customized exercises and activities to improve visual skills and how the brain processes visual information.
Complex Care Coordinator: Assists in organizing appointments and managing communication between providers.
Early Intervention Specialist : Birth to age 3, provides developmental evaluations and inhome therapies.
Education Specialist/IEP Advocate: Assists with individualized education plans (IEPs) to meet the child's needs in school.
 Respite Care Provider: Provides temporary care to give families a break from the demands of at-home medical needs, some respite care programs offer skilled nursing.

When a child is first diagnosed with CYFIP2 EIEE/DEE, families will need to engage with a multidisciplinary team of healthcare providers and specialists to address the complex needs associated with this condition. This list is meant to serve as a guide for families. Not all children will need every service listed, and some children may require additional services. Each child will have their own individual needs.
